With the beginning of the new year, and hopefully the beginning of the 2012 riding season, we would like to encourage everyone to attend parking lot practices whenever possible. Our first parking lot practice in 2012 is scheduled for Saturday, February 25, 2012, immediately following the ride to Horse Pasture, VA, for breakfast. We plan to go over some of the group riding "rules" that were in one of our recent newsletters so that we will be safe and look good on our first ride to Mebane for the Swap Meet on March 17, 2012. If you are not planning to go to the Horse Pasture breakfast, we will meet you in the Tractor Supply parking lot (park close to the highway) in Eden around 10:30 a.m.

Also, we want to encourage everyone to join the Rider Education levels program if you have not already done so. And if you have, we thank you. If you have made the commitment to ride safe (Level 1), then your next step to attaining Level 2 is taking a motorcycle class. ERC classes are available at Rockingham Community College upon request (with a 6-student minimum) and videos are available for co-riders. To attain a Level 3, you will need to take a First Aid, CPR, or Medic First Aid class. A Medic First Aid class is scheduled for April 14, 2012, at Forsyth Community College, so let us know if you are interested in taking it so that we can get your name on the list. The cost is \$30.00. As you attain each level, you will need to keep all levels current by taking advantage of educational opportunities every three years. If you have any questions or want to sign up for a level in the Rider Education Levels Program, please talk to one of us. We would love to have Chapter W at 100% participation.

THE MOTORCYCLING CHEF

MAPLE GLAZED CHICKEN

- 2 pounds skin-on, bone-in chicken breasts, cut into large chunks
- Kosher salt
- 2 tablespoons extra-virgin olive oil
- 2 apples (1 red, 1 green), cored and cut into wedges
- 8 medium shallots, quartered lengthwise
- 1/4 cup fresh sage, torn

Glaze:

- 1/2 cup low-sodium chicken broth
- 1/4 cup maple syrup
- 1/4 cup apple cider vinegar

Pat the chicken dry and season all over with salt. Heat a large heavy skillet over high heat and add the olive oil. When the oil is hot, add the chicken skin-side down and cook, undisturbed, until the skin is browned and crisp, about 5 minutes. Turn the chicken and add the apples, shallots and sage to the skillet. Reduce the heat to medium high and cook until the chicken is browned on the bottom, 4 to 5 minutes. Transfer the chicken to a plate and continue to cook the apples and shallots, stirring, until golden, about 2 more minutes.

Meanwhile, make the glaze: Mix the chicken broth, maple syrup, vinegar and 1/2 teaspoon salt in a small bowl. Add the mixture to the skillet with the apples and shallots and boil until reduced by about three-quarters, 2 to 3 minutes. Return the chicken to the skillet, turning to coat, until cooked through, about 2 more minutes.

TECH TIPS & TIDBITS

GL1800 Safety Recall: *Secondary Master Cylinder Inspection/Replacement*

Quality Assurance

Honda has a well-deserved reputation for design and manufacturing quality. Some of the ways we ensure that quality is through testing; feedback from customers, dealers, and Honda field staff; and the investigations by the staff of American Honda's Product Technical Support department. These activities form a feedback loop that provides Honda engineers and production staff with the information they need to make any necessary changes.

Sometimes improvements need to be made to vehicles that have already been produced, sold, and are in customers' hands. In these instances American Honda may issue a Service Bulletin. A Service Bulletin is the umbrella term we use for a variety of actions, depending upon the issue. Below is a list of Service Bulletins and a description of each.

- Recall-Safety: A defect may exist that could compromise safety; has no end date.
- Recall-Emissions: A defect may exist that could cause an emissions failure; has no end date.
- Recall-Compliance: Something, such as a label, is not compliant with government regulations; has no end date.
- Product Update Campaign: Not safety related, but the vehicle is inspected and/or a component updated; effective for a specified time with an end date.
- Extended Warranty: Under certain circumstances, the warranty on a component is extended to ensure longer-term protection; end date is determined by extended warranty length.

If you receive a notification that your motorcycle is affected by any of these types of Service Bulletins, please take the appropriate action as instructed in the customer letter.

GL1800 Safety Recall: *Secondary Master Cylinder Inspection/Replacement*

Through the procedure described above, Honda has determined that a safety recall is required for GL1800 motorcycles manufactured before September 2011. The recall involves the inspection and possible replacement of the Combined Brake System secondary master cylinder, which is located on the left front fork.

If you own an affected motorcycle, you should receive a letter about this recall by the end of January 2012. If you don't, perhaps through a change of address or ownership, please access our website: powersports.honda.com to download a copy of the customer letter. Then, follow the instructions in the letter to have your Gold Wing inspected at a Honda dealer.

We sincerely apologize for any inconvenience this recall may cause. However, as your safety is our first priority, please allow us to address this issue as soon as possible. (http://gwrro.org/industry_news/honda_recall.html)

Then on Sunday morning, a second email was sent. I knew how to communicate to Libby, but I needed to include Deanne on the conservations.

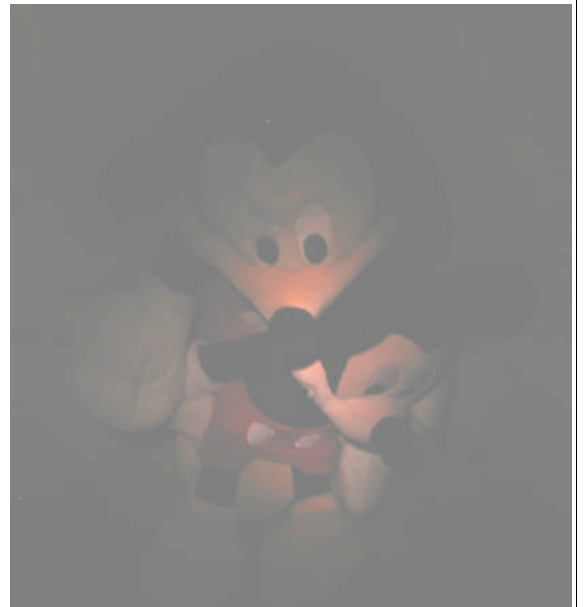
*"Mama Libby,

The sun was so bright that it blinded us and I could not see anything to help me determine where I was. In just a moment of time, they placed the bags over our heads and pulled us down. Now we are hungry, scared, and confused. I did hear them say something about there was going to be a big party and that people would come*
